Lesson Delivery (LD)

- 23. **Support content objectives** clearly.
- 24. Support language objectives clearly.
- 25. **Engage students** approximately 90-100% of the period (most students taking part and on task throughout the lesson).
- 26. **Pace** the lesson appropriately to the students' proficiency level.
